

Funds a wide variety of innovative cancer-related research and product development and for the delivery of evidence-based cancer prevention programs and services by public and private entities located in Texas.



LIFE SCIENCE INDUSTRY GROWTH IN HOUSTON (10 - 20)






7.1 MSF Cumulative Life Science Footprint

Texas Medical Center's **TMC3** is a multi-institutional 37-acre research campus that brings together the best institutions in clinical care, research and industry.




Levit Green is a 52-acre site that is slated to include a mix of office space, research facilities, retail, residential and green space.










VENTURE CAPITAL INVESTMENT


